

NEW ENGLAND SENIOR AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP CONDITIONS & REGULATIONS

ELIGIBILITY

Entries are open to amateur golfers who will have reached their 55th birthday by September 21, 2010, hold membership in a club belonging to one of the six New England State Golf Associations and have an up-to-date USGA/GHIN Handicap Index not exceeding 7.5 (for ages 55-64) and 9.4 (for ages 65 and up). Each State Association may use a limit of less than 9.4 if the number of applicants exceeds that State's number of allotted entries. The field is limited to 120 players.

Each State Association shall determine which entries it shall accept, up to and including the number allotted to it as shown below:

Connecticut	28
Maine	8
Massachusetts	42
New Hampshire	10
Vermont	10
Rhode Island	22

Entries are subject to rejection at any time (including during the tournament) by the NEGA. The reason for rejection may include unbecoming conduct.

ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entrants shall apply on the NEGA Entry Form attached. Entry fee of \$250 shall be paid by every player. Fee must accompany application. **Entries must be sent to your State Association only.**

Refund Policy: Entry fee will be refunded, regardless of reason, if the NEGA is notified before the close of entries. After the close of entries, entry fee will be refunded if the tournament is full or in the event of injury or illness, and if requested in writing. No refunds will be given after the start of the tournament. Refunds will be issued, less a 20% service charge, after completion of the Championship.

Late or incomplete entries will not be accepted. Entries by telephone, e-mail or fax will not be accepted.

Deadline for entry means time of receipt at your State Association office - not time of postmark. Entry should be mailed early to allow ample time for delay.

Entrants in the Championship will be notified by mail or e-mail of their starting time, and availability of practice privileges. Courtesy practice privileges are at the discretion of the host club.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL

If you decide not to participate, notify the NEGA office (774-430-9020) promptly. Failure to comply may result in a player being disqualified from future NEGA competition.

SCHEDULE

Competition will be 36 Holes at Stroke Play.

Monday, September 20

Player Practice Rounds

Tuesday, September 21

First Round, 18 Holes

Wednesday, September 22

Second Round, 18 Holes

Lowest scorer for 36 holes will be Champion. There will be winners in Senior and Super Senior divisions. If a tie for first place occurs, play will immediately continue hole-by-hole until a winner is determined. If ties for other positions occur, duplicate merchandise certificates will be awarded.

If the Championship course is declared unplayable and as a result it is not possible to complete 36 holes of play in the period in which the Championship is scheduled, the Championship will not be extended beyond the last scheduled day and the winner shall be the individual who returns the lowest score for the number of stipulated rounds played. The Committee may institute a cut in order to play the last stipulated round.

RULES OF GOLF

Play will be governed by the Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA. Questions shall be settled by the Committee in charge of the competition consisting of those officials assigned by the NEGA, whose decision shall be final.

CADDIES & AUTOMOTIVE TRANSPORTATION

Players may use caddies, pull carts and/or automotive transportation during play. Clubs hosting the event may require the use of carts and/or caddies affiliated with their club. Cart fees are included in the entry.

DRESS CODE

Proper dress code for all stages of the competition will be strictly observed.

CELLULAR TELEPHONES

The use of cellular telephones is prohibited.

DISTANCE-MEASURING DEVICES

In this competition, a player may use devices that measure or gauge distance only (see the Note to Rule 14-3. However, the use of a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect a player's play (e.g., gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.) is not permitted regardless of whether such an additional function is used.

GOLF SHOE POLICY

Shoes with traditionally-designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (if such metal may come in contact with the course) are prohibited. Penalty for breach of this condition: Disqualification.

PRIZES

The Harry B. McCracken Senior Amateur Trophy will be presented to the Champion along with a gold medal. The Super Senior Division Champion will also receive their respective trophy. Merchandise certificates, in each division, will be awarded. Merchandise Certificates are only redeemable at the Pawtucket Country Club Pro Shop.

PLAYERS DINNER

The NEGA cordially invites all players to a reception and dinner on Tuesday, September 21. You may bring a guest at your own expense. Please indicate your interest in attending on the NEGA entry form. It is requested that jackets and ties be worn to the reception and dinner. A buffet lunch will also be offered to competitors on September 21 and September 22.

ENTRY FORMS MUST BE RECEIVED BY 5:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, AUGUST 5, 2010
